SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation - Saturdays at 3:00 p.m., Weekdays: 15 minutes prior to Mass or please call the pastor at 255-4600 for an appointment.

Baptism - The Baptism Preparation Program and Baptism Schedule are by arrangement. Please call the parish office at 255-4600 to register prior to your delivery date and the program director will return your call. Parents must be registered at Corpus Christi or have permission from their parish.

Marriage - Couples planning to be married should call the parish office at 255-4600 at least four months in advance. Completion of required paperwork and taking the FOCCUS premarital inventory is also needed this early. This process is usually administered the fourth Thursday of each month from 7:00-9:00 p.m. Next FOCCUS meeting will be Thursday, January 28, 2016. The February FOCCUS will be on February 18, 2016.

We need volunteers to help with Corpus Christi's meals and midway games. Please stop by the sign up table downstairs after mass and see where you might be able to help. Thank You!



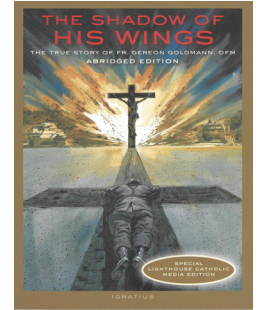

The Holy Father Speaks... Pope Francis says prayer works miracles and prevents the hardening of the heart. "It's the prayer of the faithful", the Pope said, "that brings change to the Church. Pope Francis took his cue for the Bible reading of the day which tells the story of Hannah, a woman whom, deeply distressed by her infertility, desperately prays to the Lord to give her a child, and of Eli, a priest, who looks on vaguely from afar and superficially judges the woman as a drunkard as he can see her babbling but cannot hear her words. "Hannah was praying silently, her lips moved but her voice was not heard. Hers is the courage of a woman of faith who is weeping and grieving and asks the Lord for his grace. There are many good women in the Church, many! They place all their trust in prayer... Let us think of one of them, Saint Monica who was able, with her tears, to be granted the grace of conversion for her son, Saint Augustine. "There are so many," the Pope said. "Prayer works miracles; it works miracles for Christians, whether they be faithful laypeople, priests, or bishops who have lost compassion. The prayers of the faithful change the Church: it's not us popes, bishops, priests or nuns who carry the Church forward, but Saints. Saints are those who dare to believe that God is the Lord and that He can do everything," Pope Francis concluded.

Marriage Moments: Does a typical date night in your marriage start with, "What do you want to do tonight?" "I don't know. What do you want to do?" "I don't know..." Repeat. Try something besides dinner and a movie.

Parenting Pointers: "The body is one, though it has many parts." (1 Cor 12:12) Each part of our body is important and connected. So too, is each member of the human family.
