SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation - Saturdays at 3:00 p.m., Weekdays: 15 minutes prior to Mass or please call the pastor at 255-4600 for an appointment.

Baptism - The Baptism Preparation Program and Baptism Schedule are by arrangement. Please call the parish office at 255-4600 to register prior to your delivery date and the program director will return your call. Parents must be registered at Corpus Christi or have permission from their parish.

Marriage - Couples planning to be married should call the parish office at 255-4600 at least four months in advance. Completion of required paperwork and taking the FOCCUS premarital inventory is also needed this early. This process is usually administered the fourth Thursday of each month from 7:00-9:00 p.m.

Natural Family Planning Classes are offered by the Bismarck Diocese. The methods offered are Billings Ovulation Method, Creighton Model Fertility Care System, Marquette Model and Sympto-Thermal Methods. The monster in the closet. What parent hasn't chased monsters out of closets? It's universal, this compulsion to imagine beasts in the dark. Why? Some say that children create monsters because imaginary beasts are easier to cope with than their fear of abandonment. The monster can be shooed away by the very parent the child was afraid of losing. It's a trick of the psyche we use even as adults. Take the disciples for instance: a fearful week, Jesus' horrifying death and the empty tomb were just too much. So as Jesus appeared they panicked: "It's a ghost!" What do you do with a ghost? Run away! Run away from this intimidating world where the resurrected Lord appears in your dining room. Run away from the awesome responsibility of carrying the gospel message. Yet mercifully, Jesus didn't laugh at this childish behavior. Instead He offered a simple proof to calm them. Touch me and give me something to eat. See, no ghosts here. Are you facing something fearful today? Something big and beastly lurking in the closet? Don't run away - reach out and touch your Lord, feast at His table and watch those monsters shrink to a manageable size.

The Holy Father Speaks... "In every moment of His earthly life, Jesus made mercy visible; meeting the crowds, announcing the Gospel, healing the sick, drawing close to the forgotten, pardoning sinners," Pope Francis told the crowds gathered in St. Peter's Square. "He showed a love open to all, a love which was fulfilled on the cross. His mission of mercy began in humble surroundings at the Jordan, where He stood in line with sinners to be baptized by John," the Pope continued. "The Father confirmed this mission at Jesus' Baptism when He sent the Holy Spirit upon Him and said: 'You are my beloved son; with you I am well pleased' (Mk 1:11)." The Pope added: "We can contemplate this mystery by gazing upon the cross, for there Jesus offered to the Father the sins of the world, our sins. From the cross, Jesus shows us that no one is excluded from God's merciful love: 'Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do' (Lk 23:24). We should therefore, never fear to acknowledge and confess our sins, for the Sacrament of Reconciliation offers us the forgiveness which flows from the cross and which renews us in his grace. In this Jubilee year, let us embrace the Gospel with greater vigor and be heralds of the Father's mercy and forgiveness."
