SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation - Saturdays at 3:00 p.m., Weekdays: 15 minutes prior to Mass or please call the pastor at 255-4600 for an appointment. If you are homebound and unable to come to the Church and need a priest to come to your home for confession, please call 255-4600 to set this up.

Baptism - The Baptism Preparation Program and Baptism Schedule are by arrangement. Please call the parish office at 255-4600 to register prior to your delivery date and the program director will return your call. Parents must be registered at Corpus Christi or have permission from their parish.

Marriage - Couples planning to be married should call the parish office at 255-4600 at least **10 - 12 months** in advance. Completion of required paperwork and taking the FOCCUS premarital inventory is also needed this early. This process is usually administered the fourth Thursday of each month from 7:00-9:00 p.m. Next meeting is and November 17. There will be no December meeting.

From Mouthing to Ministry. We can find it terribly easy in our faith to “go through the motions.” By the time Jesus arrived on the scene in first-century Palestine, the same thing had happened to the Pharisees and Sadducees. Instead of walking the walk, they were too busy debating and “talking the talk”. How much easier it was to agree spiritual concepts, dogma and tradition details, than to do the hard work of faith. And keeping themselves distracted wasn’t enough, they interfered with others’ active ministry too. This time, the question attempted to divert Jesus’ true teaching. Faced with the power, the spiritual authority of the Son of God, this pack of self appointed tradition keepers wanted to argue the specifics of who would be whose spouse, than face the harder truth of the resurrection they refused to believe in. Too often, we today find ourselves dealing with arcane questions that divert us from ministry. We get caught up in all consuming debates over the tiniest details, and ignore the hungry, the lost, the sick. If we could just shake off this urge to argue and lose ourselves instead in the passion of faith, we could start ministering instead of mouthing. When we begin to do, not debate, we untie God’s hands and He can work the miracles we’ve been waiting for. Where are you today: ministering or mouthing?

The Holy Father Speaks... The Pope offered a new list of Beatitudes at a Catholic Mass in Malmo, Sweden. At the Mass, which took place at the conclusion of his ecumenical trip to the country, Pope Francis highlighted the lives of the Swedish saints Elizabeth Hasselblad and Bridget of Vadstena. The best description of the saints, their 'identity card', is found in the Beatitudes from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, which begins, "Blessed are the poor in spirit."

New situations require new energy and a new commitment and I have offered a new list of Beatitudes for modern Christians:

Blessed are those who remain faithful while enduring evils inflicted on them by others and forgive them from their heart.

Blessed are those who look into the eyes of the abandoned and marginalized and show them their closeness.

Blessed are those who see God in every person and strive to make others also discover them.

Blessed are those who protect and care for our common house.

Blessed are those who renounce their own comfort in order to help others.

Blessed are those who pray and work for full communion between Christians.
