*The Holy Father Speaks.* . . . Pope Francis urges parents to bless their children at the beginning and end of each day. "Families need to open their doors to God and his love or they will harbor an individualism that endangers peace and joy," Pope Francis said on the Feast of the Holy Family. Encouraging strong and unified families is especially needed today when "the family is subjected to misunderstanding and difficulties of various kinds, which weaken it", he said before praying the Angelus with visitors gathered in St. Peter's Square. Marking the Jubilee of Families during the Holy Year of Mercy, the Pope dedicated a morning Mass and his noon Angelus address to the example and witness of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. The day's Gospel reading "invites families to welcome the light of hope originating from the house of Nazareth", he said in remarks before the Angelus. The Holy Family demonstrates what God desires for all families - that they be "a special community of life and love", he said. Mary and Joseph teach men and women today to welcome children as a gift of God, to raise them in a way that cooperates with God's divine plan, and to give "the world, with every child, a new smile." "The true joy that's experienced in the family isn't something random or accidental. It is a joy that is the result of the deep harmony between people, who savor the beauty of being together, of supporting each other on life's journey," he said. That joy also is always rooted in "God's presence, his welcoming love, mercy and patience toward everyone. If one doesn't open the door of the family to God's presence and his love, the family loses harmony, individualism prevails and joy is extinguished", he said. The Pope prayed that the Holy Family would protect the world's families so that they may live in "serenity and joy, justice and peace".

**Marriage Moments:** Epiphany: The 3 Magi (kings or wise men) recognized power in the unlikely person of a baby. Indeed it is the wisdom that helps us see the Godliness within the ordinary people in our lives. Our Beloved may seem pretty ordinary today. Look for the Godliness within.

**Parenting Pointers:** New Year's Day: Consider making a "clean break" with the start of the new year. Ask if everyone in the family would be willing to clean one space - a drawer, a shelf, a toy box? Start with taking everything out. Then put back only those items you really want. Give away or throw away the rest....*Susan Vogt*
