## **SACRAMENTS**

**Reconciliation** - Saturdays at 3:00 p.m., Weekdays: 15 minutes prior to Mass or please call the pastor at 255-4600 for an appointment.

**Baptism** - The Baptism Preparation Program and Baptism Schedule are by arrangement. Please call the parish office at 255-4600 to register prior to your delivery date and the program director will return your call. Parents must be registered at Corpus Christi or have permission from their parish.

**Marriage** - Couples planning to be married should call the parish office at 255-4600 at least four months in advance. Completion of required paperwork and taking the FOCCUS premarital inventory is also needed this early. This process is usually administered the fourth Thursday of each month from 7:00-9:00 p.m.

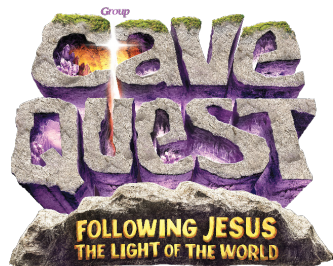

**Divine Mercy Online Event of the Year**

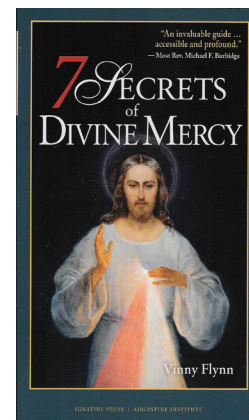

*The Holy Father Speaks...* Pope Francis held his weekly General Audience in St. Peter's Square, during the course of which he began a new chapter in his catechesis on mercy, one focusing specifically on Christ's fulfillment of the promise and action of mercy revealed to humanity through God's Chosen People, as expressed in the New Testament. The Holy Father said that the Gospels show us a Jesus who, in every moment of His earthly life, made mercy visible: meeting the crowds, announcing the Gospel, healing the sick, drawing close to the forgotten, pardoning sinners. The Pope went on to say that the love Christ showed was a love open to all, love which was fulfilled on the Cross. "Jesus," said Pope Francis in an emphatic departure from his prepared remarks, "did not bring hatred, nor did He bring enmity: He brought love - a great love - a heart open to all - to all of us - a love that saves." The Holy Father went on to say that no one is excluded from God's merciful love and that He proved this once and for all from the Cross. "We are all sinners," he said in another emphatic departure, "but we are all forgiven. We all have the possibility of receiving this pardon, which is the mercy of God; we need not fear, therefore, to recognize ourselves sinners, confess ourselves sinners, because every sin was carried by the Son to the Cross." Pope Francis concluded with an exhortation to frequent the Sacrament of Reconciliation, saying that it offers us the forgiveness that flows from the Cross and which renews us in His grace, and inviting everyone everywhere in this Jubilee Year to embrace the Gospel with greater vigor and be heralds of the Father's mercy and forgiveness.

The **Annual God's Share Appeal**, which supports the work of the Catholic Church in western North Dakota, will be conducted in every parish in two weeks. The God's Share Appeal is not just another Sunday collection. It is a unified effort in which all Catholics of the Diocese of Bismarck join together to further the mission and ministry of the Catholic Church in western North Dakota. It is an opportunity to voluntarily support the work of the larger Church by returning a portion of what God has given us through a pledge to the God's Share Appeal. In the next two weeks, you will be receiving a letter, brochure and pledge envelope from Bishop Kagan. Please take the time to prayerfully consider what you are able to give in support of Bishop Kagan's ministry.

"With the Jubilee centered on a 'genuine experience of the mercy of God,' Pope Francis wished to open the door especially to the excluded - sinners and saints alike. That door may serve, he hopes, as the path to their liberation in more ways than one." Let us continue to make everyone aware that God's mercy is waiting for them through these Holy Doors.

Bishop David Kagan has designated four churches in the diocese as places of pilgrimage during this Jubilee Year of Mercy. The churches are: **St. Joseph in Williston, St. Leo the Great in Minot, St. Mary's in Richardton at Assumption Abbey, and Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Bismarck.** We respectfully encourage you to make a pilgrimage during this Year of Mercy to one of the listed churches, enter through the Holy Doors and receive the year of Mercy Plenary Indulgence.
