SACRAMENTS

Reconciliation - Saturdays at 3:00 p.m., Weekdays: 15 minutes prior to Mass or please call the pastor at 255-4600 for an appointment. If you are homebound and unable to come to the Church and need a priest to come to your home for confession, please call 255-4600 to set this up.

Baptism - The Baptism Preparation Program and Baptism Schedule are by arrangement. Please call the parish office at 255-4600 to register prior to your delivery date and the program director will return your call. Parents must be registered at Corpus Christi or have permission from their parish.

Marriage - Couples planning to be married should call the parish office at 255-4600 at least **10 - 12 months** in advance. Completion of required paperwork and taking the FOCCUS premarital inventory is also needed this early. This process is usually administered the fourth Thursday of each month from 7:00-9:00 p.m.

Natural Family Planning Classes are offered by the Bismarck Diocese. The methods offered are Billings Ovulation Method, Creighton Model Fertility Care System, Marquette Model and Sympto-Thermal Methods. Two sides to every story. Of course it's easy to take Mary's side in today's lesson, just as Jesus did. He made an important point to the harried and overworked Martha. We must worship before we work, if we want our priorities straight. But there are always two sides to a story and often two lessons to be learned, merely by standing on the opposite side. When you're sitting at Mass, attending that meeting or retreat, have you ever considered who made it all possible? Are you one of the workers or one of the many who let the list of "to-dos" rest on the shoulders of a few? So often we arrive at events, ready to worship or participate without a single thought for the hours of preparation or cleanup. We enfold ourselves willingly in the role of Mary, basking in the experience, ignoring the Martha who made it possible. This Sunday as we read the story of these two "opposite" sisters, we may learn as much from Martha as we do from Mary, taking our turn to do work, as well as join the worship.

A new division. "Someone said our lives are equally divided between work, worry and shining. If only we could replace the last two with worship and willingness, think what the world could be!"

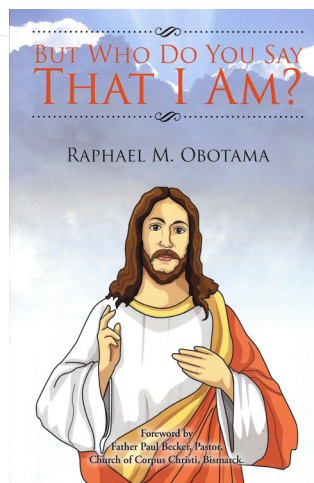

The Holy Father Speaks... Christians in Europe must break down "walls of fear and aggression" and try to understand people of other faiths and backgrounds. Invisible walls are being strengthened and dividing people from one another. These walls are being built in people's hearts. They are walls made of fear and aggression, a failure to understand people of different backgrounds or faith. They are walls of political and economic selfishness, without respect for the life and dignity of every person. Europe is called to reflect and to ask itself whether its immense heritage, so permeated with Christianity, belongs in a museum or is still able to inspire culture and to offer its treasures to the whole of humankind. The Christian organizations, meeting in Munich, are called to be models of networking "so as to welcome and show solidarity toward those who are weak and disadvantaged, to build bridges and overcome conflicts whether they are open or latent." Every authentic unity draws on the wealth of diversity which forms it - like a family which grows in unity in so far as its members can fully and fearlessly be themselves. For Europe to be a family, the good of the human person must be the central concern and groups and nations must find ways of working together that "are not only economic but also social and cultural."

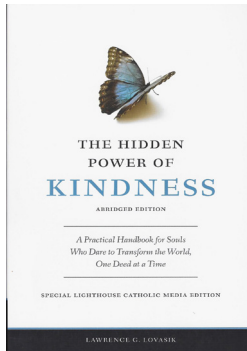
